*Be thou my Vision, O Lord of my heart;
Naught be all else to me save that thou art;
Thou my best thought by day or by night,
Waking or sleeping, thy presence my light.*

The origins of this beautiful, familiar hymn might be said to go back as far as the life and ministry of St. Patrick in Ireland in the 5th century. Born in what is now Scotland in 373, he was kidnapped by pirates and taken to Ireland as a slave when he was about 16, and there gave his life to the Lord Jesus. Although he eventually escaped and returned home, a dream one night of an Irishman pleading with him to come evangelize Ireland was impetus enough for him to return to his former captors with his most prized possession in hand, the Latin Bible. His ministry there, which began when he was about 30 and continued for decades until his death, was widespread and left Ireland covered with hundreds of churches and thousands baptized.

His work endured, and several centuries later, the Irish church was still producing hymns, prayers, sermons, and songs of worship. In the eighth century, an anonymous poem, i.e. hymn text was written which: "in its quaint Celtic style, expresses the ageless need of man to have a heavenly vision and to experience God's care and personal presence throughout this earthly pilgrimage. The author's high regard for God is evident in the various titles ascribed Him: Vision, Lord, Best Thought, Wisdom, Word, Great Father, High King, Inheritance, Treasure, Sun, Ruler, and Heart."¹

"In 1905, Mary Elizabeth Byrne, a scholar in Dublin, Ireland, translated this ancient Irish poem into English. Another scholar, Eleanor Hull of Manchester, England, took Byrne's translation and crafted it into verses with rhyme and meter. Shortly thereafter it was set to a traditional Irish folk song, 'Slane,' named for an area in Ireland where Patrick reportedly challenged local Druids with the gospel. It is one of our oldest and most moving hymns."²

*Be thou my Wisdom, and thou my true Word;
I ever with thee and thou with me, Lord;
Thou my great Father, and I thy true son,
Thou in my dwelling, and I with thee one.*

*Be thou my battle shield, sword for my fight;
Be thou my dignity, thou my delight,
Thou my soul's shelter, thou my high tower:
Raise thou me heaven-ward, O Power of my power.*

*Riches I heed not, nor man's empty praise,
Thou mine inheritance, now and always;
Thou and thou only, first in my heart,
High King of heaven, my treasure thou art.*

*High King of heaven, my victory won,
May I reach heaven's joys, O bright heaven's Sun!
Heart of my own heart, whatever befall,
Still be my vision, O Ruler of all.*

As we take to heart the message of this morning's sermon from Proverbs 29:18, may the history and the words of this much-loved hymn provide additional insight into and encouragement in our faith.

Our faith has a heritage worthy of knowing. Our God is and provides the Vision worthy of embracing.
