Then King Nebuchadnezzar was astonished and rose up in haste. He declared to his counselors, "Did we not cast three men bound into the fire?" They answered and said to the king, "True, O king." He answered and said, "But I see four men unbound, walking in the midst of the fire, and they are not hurt; and the appearance of the fourth is like a son of the gods." (Daniel 3:24-25)

After living entombed in a collapsed mine in Copiapo, Chile, for 68 days, Mario Sepúlveda captured the hearts of the rescuers and millions of TV viewers when he emerged jubilantly from the rescue capsule. He handed out souvenir rocks from the mine. He led the crowd in cheers and embraced rescuer after rescuer.

Television commentators appeared surprised that Sepúlveda was in such good spirits and apparent excellent health. While viewers expected the men to be emotionally destroyed and physically withered, TV cameras broadcast men who were upbeat, encouraging and strong.

The men certainly benefited during their captivity from excellent care given to them by doctors, counselors and even specialists from NASA. Their hearts were buoyed by the awareness that the world's top mining experts were working tirelessly to rescue them, and that millions around the world were hoping for their safety.

But it also has become clear that a surprising (to the press) number of the men held on to a hope that ultimately is greater even than all these heroic efforts. It was expressed best when Mario Gomez, the oldest miner at 63, came out of the capsule, embraced his wife and dropped to his knees to offer thanks to God.



Early in the morning following his rescue, Mario Sepúlveda faced the cameras flanked by his wife, son and daughter. He had this to say: “I have faced many situations, but I think this was the hardest. ... I was with God and I was with the Devil, but God won. I held on to God's hand—the best hand—and at no point in time...did I doubt that God would get me out of there.”

Rejoice in the Lord alway; and again I say, Rejoice!

Let your softness be known unto all men: the Lord is even at hand.

*Be careful for nothing, but in all prayer and supplication,

*And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding,
keep your heart and minds through Christ Jesu.*

Softness: other translations read “gentleness,” “moderation,” “forbearance” or “reasonableness.”

Careful: “full of care,” “anxious”
