Do you remember what your life was like before you knew Jesus Christ? Consider, for a moment, the way your life has changed forever since the day you trusted Christ as your Savior.

Would you like to be an instrument of this change in someone else's life?

This summer, we have that opportunity, the opportunity to share the gospel of salvation with people and, by God's grace, watch as He brings them to trust in His Son, Jesus Christ, for the first time. Are you interested in being used by God in this way?

In August, Quebec City will celebrate its 400th anniversary. Quebec Espoir (Hope) 2008 is a strategic project to share the love of God with those who do not know Christ. This time of celebration is strategic because the hearts of the Quebecois are ripe for the harvest. There is little Christian presence among the 600,000 resident of Quebec City; 99.94% of them do not know Christ.

The Christians in Quebec need 3,000 people to partner with them to share the gospel of Christ during the citywide celebration. We would like to send a team of 25 people from CBC to serve alongside our missionary in Quebec, François Picard. Our group will participate in strategic evangelism, such as door to door visits, distributing copies of the Gospel of John, and personally inviting people to events involving a gospel presentation. The dates of our trip will be Saturday, August 2nd through Thursday, August 7th, 2008 (the outreach will be going on a few days before and a few days after our trip). The accommodations will be at the Quebec Espoir headquarters on the campus of College Francois Xavier Garneau, see www.cegep-fxg.qc.ca for pictures.

Pray to God for guidance and seek wise counsel from family, friends, elders, pastors and others who can give you good advice about going on this mission.

CONGRATULATIONS are extended from their CBC family to Max and Thelma Biegert, who on April 9th were inducted into the National Railroad Hall of Fame located in Galesburg, Illinois. Their honor was bestowed at the Grand Canyon Railway's Depot in Williams. The restoration of the Grand Canyon Railway (which originally opened on September 17, 1901 and ran until 1968) was begun by the Biegerts in the mid 1980's and successfully returned railway service to the line on September 17, 1989, exactly 88 years after the first passenger train ran on the line. It provides transportation into the Grand Canyon National Park from Williams for more than 230,000 people each year via restored steam and vintage diesel locomotives, along with classic coaches.

DISCOVERY II, our four week series of classes offered quarterly and designed to provide a fuller understanding of God's purpose for His church and our part in it, is scheduled to begin next Sunday, April 27th, and run through May 18th. The time is 6:00 PM and the place is Fellowship Hall. With attendance at Discovery I a pre-requisite, this series also prepares those interested for the joy of membership. As explained in our *First Steps* brochure: "Since we seek to anchor all our ministries in a high view of God, we will, in our first session together, open the Bible and peer into the fathomless dimensions of the Lord's glory. We will trace its spectacular earthly manifestation in the cross of Jesus Christ and discover how it transforms us into completely new human beings – making us servants in our world as Christ was in his. In the following three sessions, we will look at the practical ways we seek to serve like Christ at CBC. Topics will include: 1) How we are drawn in to Christ; 2) How we are built up in Christ; and 3) How we are sent out for Christ."
